## FLORAL HALL EXHIBIT CATEGORIES

Entries accepted on Thursday, July 31, 2025 from 10am-1pm

Judging Thursday afternoon—2:00 p.m. (judges and volunteers only)

Ribbons will be awarded according to merit regardless of the number of entries in the class. Judges' decisions are final. Premiums offered in each class: Blue ribbon - \$5, Red ribbon—\$3. An overall Championship ribbon will be given to the local exhibitor having the most first place ribbons in Floral Hall building. County Homemakers will have Floral Hall open for viewing during advertised times. Do not call the Extension Office for results.

### GENERAL RULES GOVERNING EXHIBITS

1. **Entry time for Floral Hall will be Thursday, July 31 from 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M.** Live Flowers will be taken this day also.
2. Entries limited to one article per class per person and should be MADE by the person within the last two years, whose name item is entered in.
3. One article cannot be entered as two entries.
4. The utmost care will be used to guard and protect exhibits, but there is no guarantee items will not be lost/damaged.
5. **Exhibits and premiums must be picked up on Saturday, August 2nd from 1-3 P.M.**
6. No entries will be released without entry receipt stub.
7. Previous first place winning articles should not be exhibited.
8. Must be a resident of LaRue County.

General entries open to amateurs only. Professional Bakers category for those who bake professionally.

Use disposable containers and cover with lids or plastic wrap. *Commercial mixes should not be used.*

## FLOWER DIVISION

### ***RULES:***

1. All cultivated entries must be grown by exhibitor.
2. Arrangement class flowers need not be grown by exhibitor. Do not mix artificial flowers in with live flowers.
3. **Entry time for flowers - 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Thursday, July 31, 2025.**
4. Exhibits may be free standing.
5. Roses true to variety and color.
6. Only one entry per class.

### Judges suggestions:

- Unworthy exhibits will not be considered. Judges suggest removing all bad or damaged end petals/leaves from entries.
- Remove any stem leaves that are under the water in you bottle or vase
- Make sure your display container doesn't leak
- Display all homegrown entries in plain, clear glass bottles or vases
- Choose prime plants and/or blossoms to enter
- Use nice, clean planters, vases, etc. with no visible mud or dirt on your container
