 2 MEDIUM CARROTS, CHOPPED
 1/2 CUP CANNED-IN-JUICE PINEAPPLE TIDBITS, DRAINED
 1/4 CUP LOW-FAT VANILLA

YOGURT 1/2 CUP NONFAT MILK 4-5 ICE CUBES

DASH CINNAMON (OPTIONAL) 1/2 TEASPOON VANILLA EXTRACT (OPTIONAL)

- 1. WASH HANDS WITH SOAP AND WARM WATER, SCRUBBING FOR AT LEAST 20 SECONDS.
- 2. RINSE CARROTS UNDER COOL RUNNING WATER AND SCRUB WITH A CLEAN VEGETABLE BRUSH TO REMOVE ANY DIRT BEFORE CHOPPING.

3. ADD BANANA, CARROT, PINEAPPLE, YOGURT, MILK, ICE, AND CINNAMON AND VANILLA (IF USING) TO A BLENDER, AND BLEND UNTIL SMOOTH. IF NEEDED, ADD MORE MILK TO ENCOURAGE BLENDING.

WHO: School students attending public, private, or home school located within the Commonwealth of Kentucky enrolled in kindergarten through twelfth grade.

WHEN: The contest begins on: November 1, 2024 and ends on: December 8, 2024.

HOW: Participants submit an original piggy bank and entry form

RECOGNITION: Area winners will have their names, grades, counties and winning piggy banks displayed in the Capitol Rotunda in Frankfort, Kentucky during March and April 2025.

Ninners also will receive a certificate

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Entries must meet the following requirements to be eligible for judging:

- a. The bank cannot exceed
- 12 inches X 12 inches X 12 inches
- 1 square foot).
- b. Piggy banks must be able to hold coins (i.e., include a slot that has been cut
- Piggy banks must be created or decorated by the youth contestant.
- I. Plastic or ceramic banks piggy banks may be used, but must be personally
- Piggy banks DO NOT have to be in the shape of a pig.



Beverly has been a 4-H volunteer for 44 years. She is currently coleader of the cooking club and serves on the 4-H council. She has served in many different volunteer roles over her years of service.

"I enjoy working with children. They are so open to new ideas and willing to try new things. Working with them is like a breath of fresh air.

The wonderful thing about 4-H is the opportunities that are available that every child could be able to excel in. They may not be able to be on the honor roll or excel at sports however, they may be able win an award for crafts, sewing, cooking or shooting sports. I have seen children that were shy and lacked the self-assurance to speak in front of people that became excellent public speakers.

I began by helping with sewing. I have enjoyed sewing, cooking, arts & crafts. My favorite would be the 4-H beef cattle club. This was before the livestock project of today. I think this was the group that I became closest to and still am. We spent so much time together as a group. We worked together as families and 4-Hers. We went to so many events together and worked together to help each other when one parent was unable to go. We spent hours together at the state fair each year. Money was short so we slept in the barn, ate in the barn and made best friends there.

My favorite memory from when I was in 4-H is difficult to choose. I remember what a thrill it was to go to the mail box and get the Courier Journal where the placings were printed for 4-H entries in the state fair. Another memory was having the honor to model my 4-H sewing project at the state style show. I had made a red semi-formal dress with a black velvet jacket. The wife of the president of the University of Kentucky invited the participants to their home for a tea. This was a formal tea with all the trimmings. I was a nervous wreck. I learned a lot at this event. That is the reason that I keep saying that our 4-Hers need to have some formal events to prepare them for the future. I want them to be comfortable in any setting that they may find themselves in.

How have I benefited from 4-H? I have used things that I learned in 4-H all through my adult life. Those record books I had to fill out prepared me as basis for income tax forms. I may not have wanted to do a demonstration or speech but those basics gave me the confidence to speak before a National Santa Gertrudis convention, do programs before DAR groups, be an Organizing President of a National Children of the American Revolution Chapter or Serve on a National Junior Heifer Show Committee. My husband Pat and I had a National Santa Gertrudis Show dedicated to us. This honor that we received started with a Christmas present of 3 heifers that our 9 & 10-year-old sons wanted to show in 4-H.

It is such a joy to see these young people that have passed through our lives as successful adults. This is what 4-H is all about."
